The first evening saw a group up Orrest Head with splendid views of the central fells. The first full day found us on the Fairfield Horseshoe in fine sunshine. One team – the three fittest! – did the whole horseshoe comprising Nab Scar; Heron Pike; Great Rigg; Fairfield; Dove Crag; High and Low Peak. Other parties did parts of this. Situated on the border of the Light Peak with Lower Carboniferous Limestone and the Dark Peak with Upper Carboniferous Millstone Grit, Edale proved to be a good choice for a variety of fell walks. The first day saw one party up Kinder Scout via Jacob's Ladder, with lunch at Pym's Chair. The weather was fine though the strong Easterly proved trying on the top. Some of the weathered gritstone features were memorable, as the photograph shows.
